BIENNIAL REPORT

Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2021 and 2022





There should be nothing to report for the Weitzman's fiscal years 2021 and 2022. Save for May 2022, when it reopened, the Museum's doors were closed to the public due to Covid. The pandemic, however, proved to be a watershed in creativity as governments, businesses, nonprofits, families, and our Museum, adapted to a changed environment.

Building on a modest but growing virtual presence, our small but nimble staff pivoted instantly to an all-online operation, remaining vibrant and serving our mission while sustaining and growing our increasingly national and virtual audience.

The Museum created six new special exhibitions online, covering topics including suffrage, farming, and silent film. But with its galleries eerily quiet, the Museum needed to find a way to continue to make its exceptional Core Exhibition available to the public. The entire exhibition was photographed and converted into a virtual tour, available on the Museum's website.

The Museum was not about to forego its public programming, even if audiences could no longer assemble in the Museum's Dell Theater. So, programming went virtual as well, with some 67 programs attracting over 60,000 viewers. Online programs celebrated holidays, music, history, authors, food, films, and fresh and contemporary topics that engaged more than thirty national partners as co-presenters.

The Weitzman conducted more than 40 educational programs including the National Educators' Institute, docent trainings, a virtual summer camp, virtual tours, and programs for schools and adults across the country.

The Museum continued its role as the lead organizer of the national Jewish American Heritage Month celebration, held each May by Presidential proclamation. The coalition of national JAHM partners convened by the Museum grew significantly during this time (from 50 to 120), as did awareness among the media, across online platforms, and in the highest levels of government.

Despite its successes in cyberspace, the Museum continued to yearn to reopen its building—a challenge in the face of Covid but also because of the financial exigencies it faced under Chapter 11. And so, with the extraordinary support of friends and donors, the Museum also staged three fundraising galas, one entirely virtual honoring David Copperfield, one celebrating the emergence from bankruptcy, and the third honoring Wolf Blitzer. The Museum was now positioned, financially, to throw open its doors.

The Museum began welcoming the public in May 2022, greeting them with OY/YO as well as the large scale indoor contemporary art installations of *The Future Will* Follow the Past. Reflecting the rise in antisemitism and the reality of a newly vulnerable American Jewish community, the Museum acquired and placed on display artifacts from the 2022 synagogue hostage crisis in Colleyville, Texas.

As the Museum's fiscal year drew to a close on June 30, 2022, we had welcomed nearly 4,000 visitors in person and audiences were returning to the first several in-person public programs in the theater. The Weitzman was back!

If you visit the corner of 5th and Market in Philadelphia, your eyes will immediately be drawn to *OY/YO*, the Deborah Kass sculpture now residing in front of The Weitzman. In its multicultural message, it encapsulates the two years we are sharing in this "annual" report—the "OY" of being closed for Covid while beset by bankruptcy proceedings, and the "YO" of welcoming myriad new online audiences to our programs and (when we reopened in May 2022) visitors in person to our exhibitions.

We are once again sharing the 369-year journey through American Jewish history in our galleries, extraordinary public programs in our Dell Theater, and a provocative reflection on our history set against today's social issues in *The Future Will Follow the Past:* An Exhibition by Jonathan Horowitz. Our educational programs and group tours are sharing the story—and relevance—of America's Jewish community locally and nationally.

Yet, even before we reopened, our Board leadership was envisioning something more—an institution that would serve the Jewish community more intensively while engaging the broader American public more extensively. The Weitzman of the future will be a "must" on any visit to Philadelphia's historic district, a highly interactive exploration of the American experience through the lens of Jewish history.

We are where we are—and we are going where we are going—because a highly committed group of philanthropists and trustees saw possibility where, just recently, there was debilitating financial challenge. We are where we are—and we are going where we are going—because a creative and resourceful staff has created relevance where there were locked doors. We are where we are—and we are going where we are going—because our docents and volunteers, visitors and program participants, members and donors, have continued to make The Weitzman the premier location in which American Jewish history comes alive to inspire Jews and diverse audiences alike to see the promise and possibility that is America.
